Brian Manktelow was elected to the New York State Assembly on November 6, 2018. The district includes all of Wayne County, the towns of Aurelius, Brutus, Cato, Conquest, Ira, Mentz, Montezuma, Sennett, Sterling, and Victory in Cayuga County, and the towns of Hannibal, Minetto, and Oswego in Oswego County.











Civic or community involvement

- Brian served in the U.S Army, attaining the rank of sergeant after graduating from Williamson High School. He then completed classes at the University of Chicago and Finger Lakes Community College, where he pursued a degree in political science.
- He has been the Lyons Town Supervisor since 2009 and has served as Vice Chairman of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors.
- He was chairman of the board's Finance Committee and also served on the Government Operations and Human Services committees.
- Brian was instrumental in initializing the Wayne County Land Bank in 2017 to rejuvenate derelict properties, get them back on the tax rolls, and reduce blight.
